Career Events and School Presentations

Since the beginning of the year, Industry Ambassadors representing the A Life Without Limits program attended over 18 career expos and information events throughout the Perth metropolitan area and regional WA including Bunbury, Geraldton and Exmouth. This is a massive effort resulting in countless volunteer hours.

The objective of attending the careers expos was simply to start raising awareness of surveying as a career. Unfortunately we were working from a very low awareness base, but the more career events we attended, the more students, parents and career advisers we talked to, with the opportunity to explain exactly what we do on a daily basis, being in the career mix, and providing alternative options for students to make their decisions.

We are hearing of students taking up work experience opportunities with various members so hopefully there will be a flow-on effect in the years to come.













Student Uptake

It is encouraging to see a significant increase in interest for University and TAFE surveying courses heading into 2022.

- Curtin's Year12 first round preferences has increased (TISC) from 24 (2020) to 37 (2021).
- TAFE has increased student numbers: Cert3 = 30, Cert4 = 38, Diploma = 34. TAFE is expecting ~60 Cert3 in 2022.
- Interest in Mine Surveying has also picked up.
- Work Experience interest is increasing with a number of WAIS members placing students.

Hopefully these numbers will continue to climb through 2022 and beyond.
